OXANA CHI AND LAYLA ZAMI KILLJOY, FEELINGJAZZ

Oxana Chi is an award-winning choreographer, dancer, filmmaker, curator and publisher. An Afro-German artist based in New York since 2015, she is currently 2017-2018 Artist-in-Residence at Abrons Arts Center and JCAL. As the Founder and Choreographer of Oxana Chi & Ensemble Xinren since 1991, she produced 18 feature-length productions including two commissioned works for the Humboldt-University, Berlin. She developed her own style: a transcultural fusion blending Western African, Egyptian, South East Asian and European traditional and contemporary techniques. She toured at theaters, universities and festivals in France, India, Finland, UK, Indonesia, Germany, Taiwan, Martinique, Turkey, Singapore and Australia. In NYC, she has appeared at NYU Jack Crystal Theater, MR@Judson Church, BAAD!, Dixon Place, CUNY, LaMaMa, LAVA Dance, WOW Café Theatre, University Settlement, CPR. Chi has received several international awards and grants, and was honored as a Filmmaker of Inspiration and Ambassador of Peace at the DOSHIMA 2016 in Jakarta.

Layla Zami is an independent artist and scholar working with words, music, theater, video and photo art. She graduated from Humboldt-University, Berlin with a Ph.D. in Gender & Cultural Studies, and holds an MA from Sciences Po Paris School of International Affairs. Layla studied saxophone at the Conservatory of Music in Le Mans, as well as with Fuasi Abdul-Khaliq, Pascal Maffei and Parageet. Born in Paris, Layla is rooted in an Afro-Indian-Caribbean and Jewish-Russian-European cultural heritage and blossoms on stage as a Resident Artist (saxophone, poetry, kalimba, chalumeau) with her partner Oxana Chi. They performed across the globe at events and venues such as Delhi International Queer Theatre and Film Festival, Solo International Performing Arts Indonesia, HAU Theater, Technical University Berlin, Rutgers University Philadelphia, BAAD!, CUNY, Werkstatt der Kulturen Berlin. Layla is currently an Assistant Producer for the International Human Rights Art Festival (IHRAF) and serves on Dance/NYC's Research Task Force and Symposium Programming Committee. www.laylazami.net

Choreographer/performer **Laura Shapiro** is delighted to have been invited to perform her work at the BAAD!ASS Women's Festival for the third time. Her independent artistic journey has taken her from New York to the Northwest, Asia and Europe. In recent years her group and solo choreography has been presented in New York City by DraftWork at Danspace

Project, Dixon Place, Lower East Side Festival of the Arts at Theater for the New City, Movement Research at the Judson Church, 92nd Street Y Harkness Dance Center, The Construction Company and the West End Theater. Her movement style is informed by extensive study of traditional and new, Eastern and Western approaches to alignment, energy and awareness, which informs her teaching as well as her choreography. Since 2008 Gurian has been creating video for the Roy Nathanson and Jazz Passengers/Sotto Voce on-going concert project "Subway Moon," which has been presented at MassMOCA, Joe's Pub, The Cooper Union, Lincoln Center's Rubenstein Atrium, in New York City; Paris's Banlieues Bleues Festival; and the Sage Gateshead in Newcastle, England, as well as at Kampnagel in Hamburg, Germany and Snug Harbor on Staten Island.
